



Homebred's gentle giant

This is 'Ziggy' Homebred's unnamed 1999 Chesnut gelding by Environment Friend ex Royal Brush (King of Spain)

Ziggy is a really powerful, well grown, half brother to our successful hurdler Prince de Galles. His sire Environment Friend was a high class horse on the flat whose victories included the Group 1 Eclipse Stakes over 1¼ miles at Sandown Park. Environment Friend is now also proving to be a producer of good winners over hurdles as well as on the

flat. Royal Brush's stock need time to grow into themselves so, after being broken and ridden away as a yearling by Gerry Enright, we've given Ziggy time turned out at grass. The plan will be to introduce him to National Hunt flat races before going over jumps. He'll be trained by Gerry Enright at Lewes in Sussex and will join his yard in July.

Gerry says "I loved this horse as soon as he came to me - he's a real gentle giant. Ziggy has a great outlook on life, is a kind horse and for such a big lad he's a really good mover". Now he's been given time to mature Gerry thinks he's ready to start work with the intention of running in NH flat races - but Gerry says "If he jumps well I might just send him straight over hurdles".

The history of racing

The National Horseracing Museum in Newmarket tells the story of racing through the Museums permanent collections, featuring the horses, people, events and scandals that made it so colourful. Highlights include the head of Persimmon, a great Royal Derby winner in 1896; a special display about Fred Archer, the Victorian jockey who committed suicide after losing the struggle to keep his weight down; the skeleton of Eclipse, ancestor of 90% of modern thoroughbreds; items associated with Red Rum, Lester Piggott, Frankie Dettori and other heroes of the Turf...

Know the rules...

There is often much confusion as to whether a horse will or should be disqualified after interference. The Jockey Club's Rules of Racing state that when a horse or rider causes any interference:

- ...intentionally or by reckless riding that upon objection **it will be disqualified.**
- ...by irresponsible riding, that upon objection **be placed**



behind the horse(s) with which it has interfered...

unless the stewards are of the opinion that the interference did not improve the horse's placing in relation to the horses with which it interfered.

The key word in this second scenario is undoubtedly 'opinion' and this is where controversy is often created. Show ten people a replay and you'll probably get ten different opinions!
